FIRE/RESCUE: Report was given by Kaitlin Kubiskey. May recorded 12 EMS runs, 3 Fire Runs, 1 EMS Meeting, 1 Fire Meeting/Training and 1 Maintenance Meetings. The throttle cable for the Polaris fire pump broke and has been replaced. Annual DOT inspections, oil changes, and maintenance have begun on the apparatuses. Summer tires were put on 105. A joint training was completed with Bear Lake and Manistee Township

with a tour of the Onekama School. Another joint training was done with Bear Lake, Manistee Township, and Statewide Towing with Vehicle Extrication. This could not be done without the dedication and help from John Adams and his crew at Statewide Towing. Thank you, John! Also, a Thank you to AAW-STERAMIST Certified Applicators for allowing us to use their property for the training. New EMS vehicle requirements have been sent to us from the State of Michigan. Adjustments have been complete to 105. **Motion** by Blackmore, Second by Beebe for the purchase of wildland gear per Quote 186667-0 from 5 Alarm, and Quote 9657 from First Due, not to exceed \$8,000. Roll Call Vote: Wisniski – Yes, Blackmore – Yes, Beebe – Yes, Johnson – Yes, and Meister – Yes. M/C

ROADS: Manistee County Road Commission Cost Estimate Packet was presented by Mark Sohlden for Second Street and Portage Point Road Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) Wedging, Overlay, and Chip and Fog Sealing (from Langland Park to Ninth Street). **Motion** by Blackmore, Second by Wisniski to approve the cost estimate totaling \$31,600 with Onekama paying \$15,800 and the Road Commission paying \$15,800. PLANNING COMMISSION: Report given by Al Taylor on the last meeting. There is an open position on the Planning Commission. There is also a Special Meeting posting for May 14 at 7pm.

ASSESSOR: Report given by Ginny Martz. We are rolled over into the 2020 database. The miscellaneous totals and statistics reports for 2019 and 2020 were generated and checked. Everything balanced. The deadline for filing for a principal residence exemption is June 1. We will be submitting the database electronically to Equalization by June 9. An appeal was received for the Michigan Tax Tribunal, and we responded to that appeal on April 16th.

PARKS & REC: Report by Rich Lapinski. One resident of the Township, Michelle Ervin, expressed an interest in becoming a committee member. The sealing contractor will apply the asphalt walkway seal coat very soon.

MTA: Wisniski and Meister will attend the annual dinner.

PLA: Report by Al Taylor. The Shoe Drive is in full force and doing well. The planting of the petunias is on schedule. Preparation is being made for Onekama Days. The adult prom night went well. The group is looking at doing it again next year.

WATERSHED/INVASIVES: Report given by Mary Reed. The notices for the second public hearing are to be sent out on Friday. The updated watershed plan is to be complete by June 12. The Management report from Bre is on file. The permit cost is now \$800, and grants are available. Reed gave an update on the Purple Loosestrife, and the Point of Sale Public Hearing. Reed also attended the Lakes & Streams Conference.

TLSA: Meeting was on Wednesday, May 1st. The application is not complete as the Village of Onekama is now interested in participating. The next meeting is scheduled for June 5, at the Bear Lake Township Hall at 7 pm.

SAW GRANT: Reed reported that the goal is to submit the grant by November 2020. Six of the seven items are complete.

NEW BUSINESS: Vanderwal, Spratto, & Richards will be here this week.
